



**Rely on Ross. We do it right!**

For regulatory, permit or operational reasons, Ross Incineration Services, Inc. must control receipt or profiling of certain waste streams. As a result, the company may require separate waste profiles for certain waste streams or may control the scheduling and receipt of the wastes.

A quick reference guide to restricted waste codes and problematic wastes follows to explain how Ross Environmental will work with you to manage these wastes. ### **D002 & D003, P-listed Codes**

These codes denote corrosive, reactive or particularly toxic wastes. Many RIS production decisions are impacted by the type or nature of these wastes. As such, RIS does not allow D002, D003 or P-listed code wastes to be profiled generically. Instead, specific components causing the corrosivity/reactivity/toxicity must be identified. Should you have specific opportunities requiring the use of the D002, D003 or P-listed waste codes, please submit a Waste Product Survey (WPS) specific to the waste stream and we will be happy to work with you to obtain waste approval.

### **Problematic Waste Codes**

Certain waste codes pose difficulty in terms of residual disposal. While they are on RIS' permit, these codes may require treatment by technologies other than incineration. For that reason, the waste codes below have been removed from generic profiles. Please contact Customer Service for availability of these waste codes.

- K174, K175, K176, K177, K181
- P092, P202
- U151, U214, U215, U216

## **Problematic Wastes**

Certain waste types inherently require special handling either for safety or operational reasons. This sometimes means that profiling, scheduling and receipt of certain waste types is carefully controlled, either by limiting the quantity of material that RIS will manage or scheduling receipt of the wastes during specific time periods. Your understanding of, and cooperation in adhering to, these controls helps RIS continue to provide the safe, compliant, low cost waste management services you've come to expect. RES will communicate any receipt restrictions to you in the quote letter for each waste stream so that you will know of any restrictions before you ship the waste. Contact RES' Logistics department to schedule all wastes in advance of shipment, and they will help you comply with any waste stream receipt restrictions.

A list of problematic waste examples follows. Not all wastes that fall in to these general categories are controlled, and the list is not all inclusive. Contact your Technical Service Representative to discuss the specifics of your waste streams.

### **Problematic Waste Examples**

- Temperature Sensitive Materials: Refrigerated or Heated
- Oxidizers and Organic Peroxides
- Materials Requiring Witnessed Destruction – Substances controlled by law or by Generator request
- Materials containing problematic elements (ex: P, Na, etc.)
