- Provides increased regulatory transparency
- Provides greater accessibility to manifest data
- Aims to reduce the amount of paperwork that industries and states need to complete

e-Manifest Third Rule

IMPACT ON GENERATORS

IMPORTANT DATES:

DECEMBER 1, 2025:

All Exception, Discrepancy, and Unmanifested Waste Reports will be submitted electronically in the e-Manifest system. This submittal will make these reports readily available for US EPA and State EPA organizations.

JANUARY 1, 2026:

For loads received by Ross Incineration Services on or after this date, paper copies will no longer be mailed back to generators. Signed manifests will only be available in the e-Manifest system. (Very Small Quantity Generators [VSQGs] will continue to receive manifest via mail)

KEY UPDATES:

Generator Registration: Small Quantity Generators (SQGs) and Large Quantity Generators (LQGs) must register in the EPA's e-Manifest system to access final signed manifest copies.

New Manifest Form: A new manifest form has not yet been made available by US EPA. As such, use of the new manifest form is currently on hold.

Elimination of Mailed Copies: Receiving facilities will no longer mail paper copies back to generators. Signed manifests will only be available through the e-Manifest system.

Electronic Reporting: Beginning December 1, 2025, Exception, Discrepancy, and Unmanifested Waste Reports will be submitted directly into the e-Manifest system.

Data Corrections: Manifest data errors will be corrected electronically within the system.
